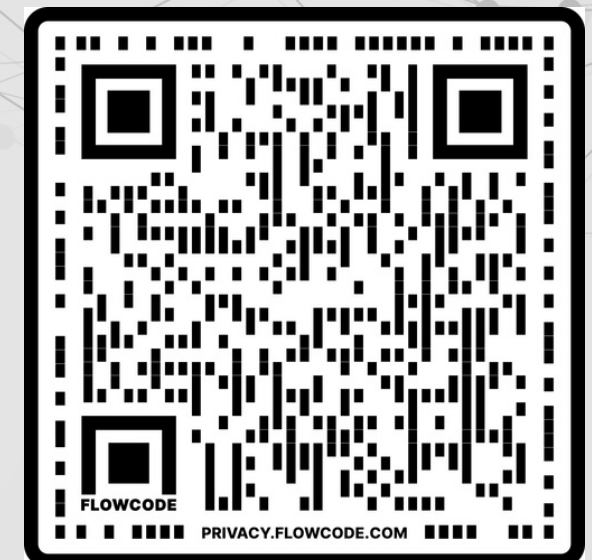

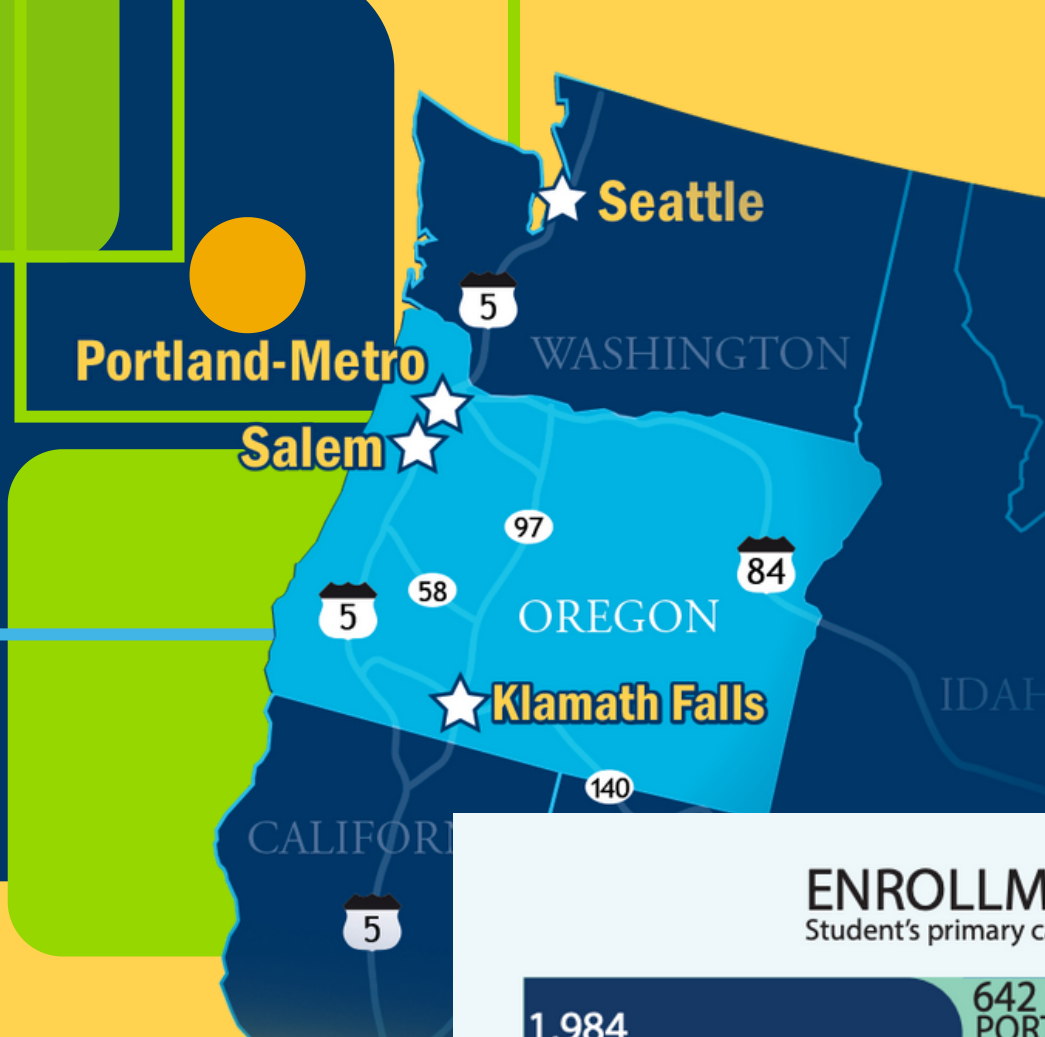

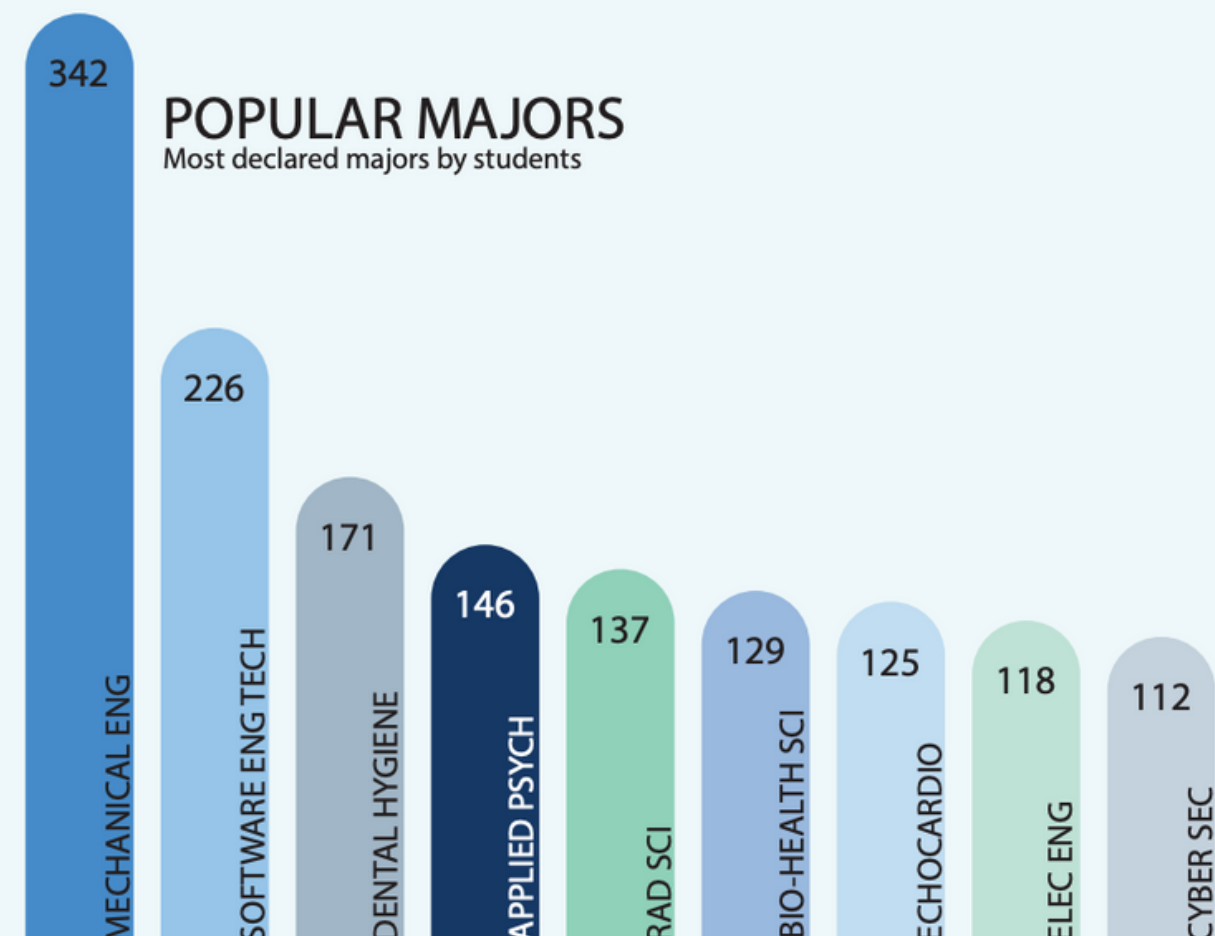
ENROLLMENT BY CAMPUS

Student's primary campus



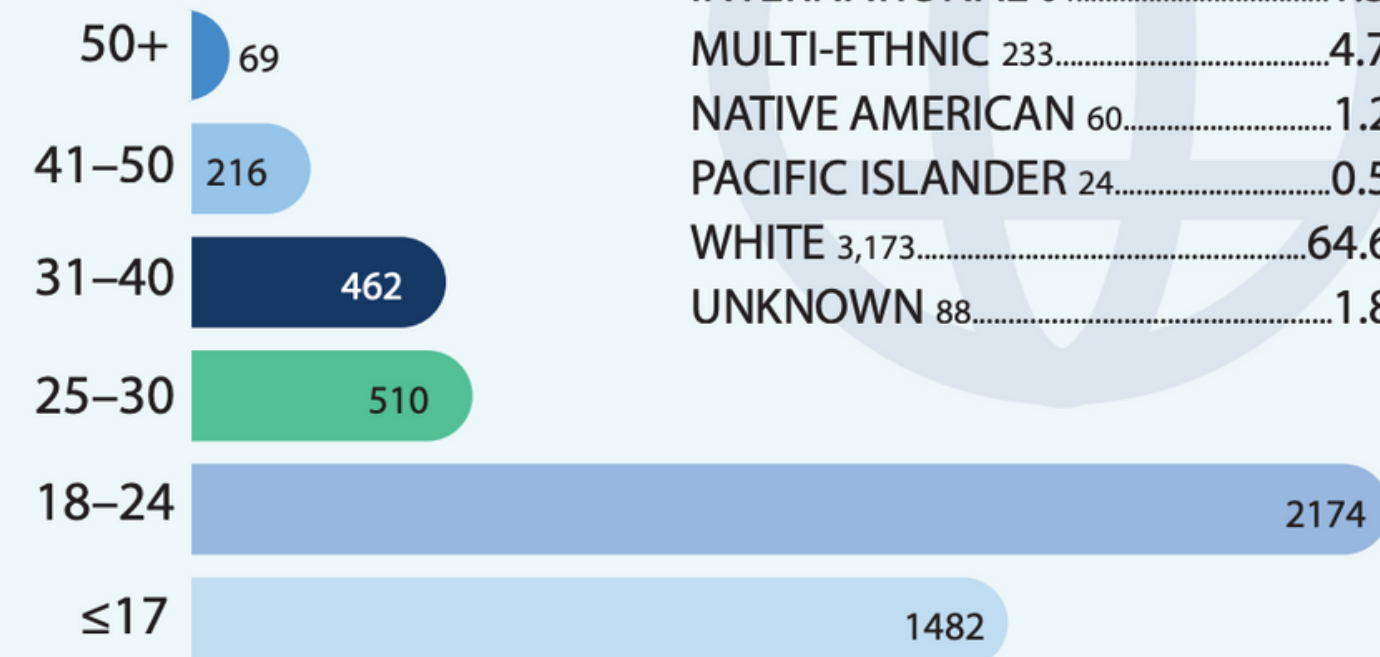
POPULAR MAJORS

Most declared majors by students

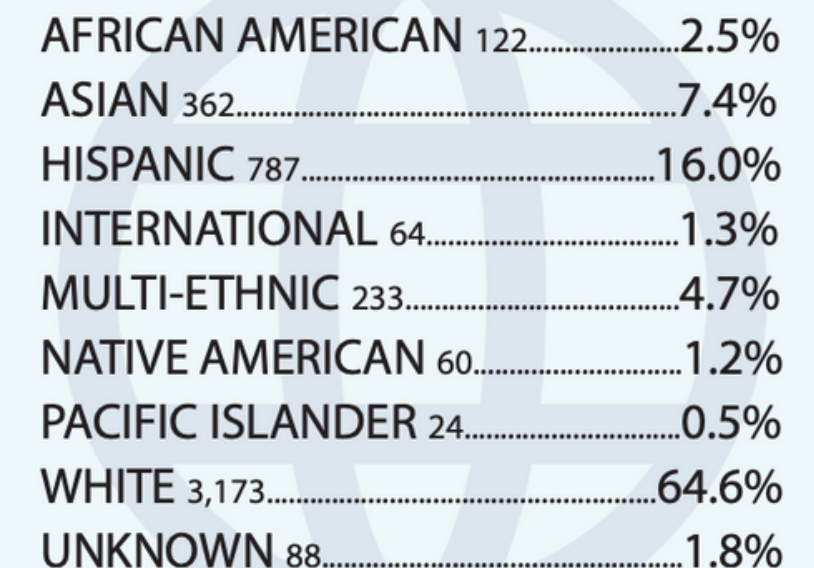


DEGREES CONFERRED

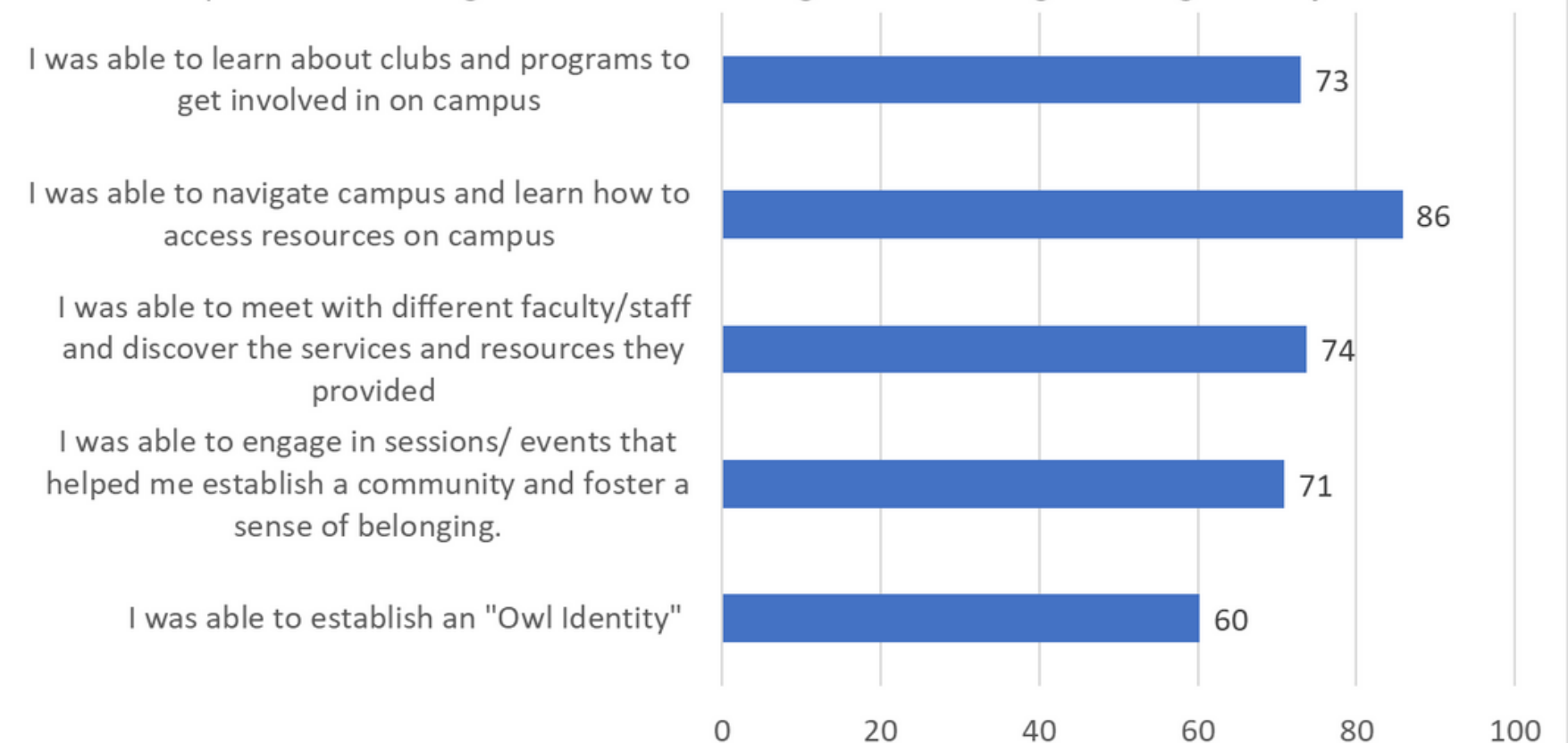

WHAT WAS THIS PROGRAM LACKING THAT COULD BE IMPACTING OUR FIRST YEAR STUDENTS?

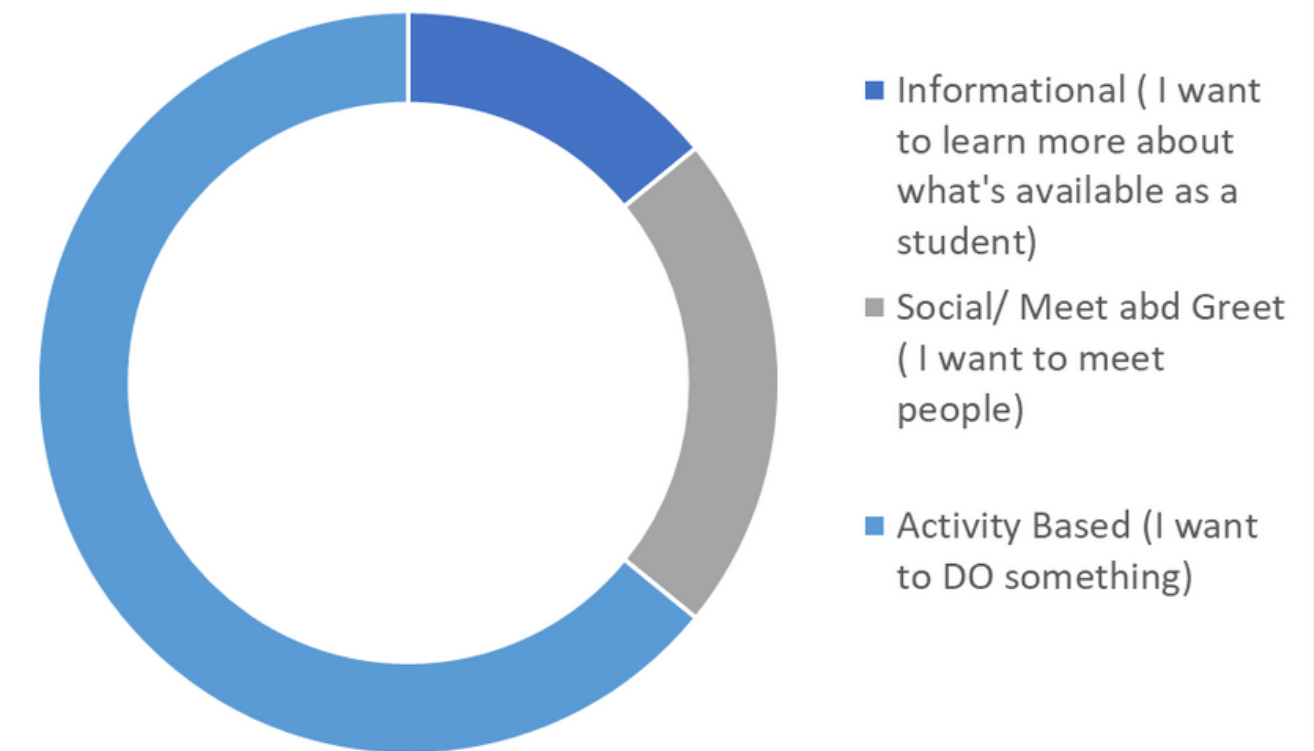
ASSESSMENT FINDINGS

- Able to learn and find resources on campus to help them be successful.
- The two lowest agreeance questions were “I felt connected with other students on campus” and “I felt the activities with faculty and staff across campus allowed me to start building relationships with them.”
- University staff and faculty involvement were low outside of student affairs, the program was outsourced due to the availability of staff to help plan and organize such a program.

CHANGES FOR 2022

- Create an in-house experience
- Create goals and outcomes that our student population can achieve
- Cross-campus collaboration, bringing in campus partners
- Develop this program to be a TRUE HIP (High Impact Practice)
- Student Development theory, and lack of intentionality behind our orientation experience and how it plays a role in the student experience

Graph 1.4: What kind of events do you (student) want more of?



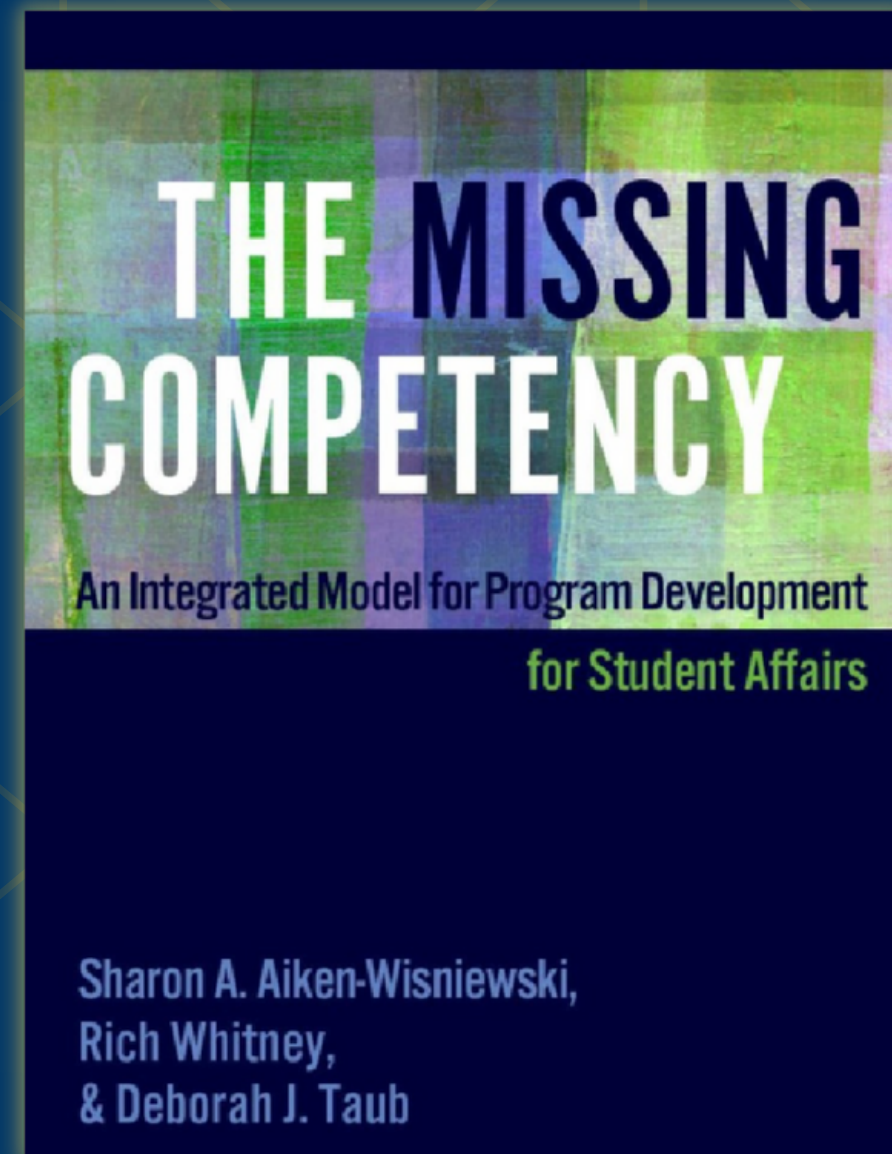

TAKEAWAYS FROM 2022 FYE:

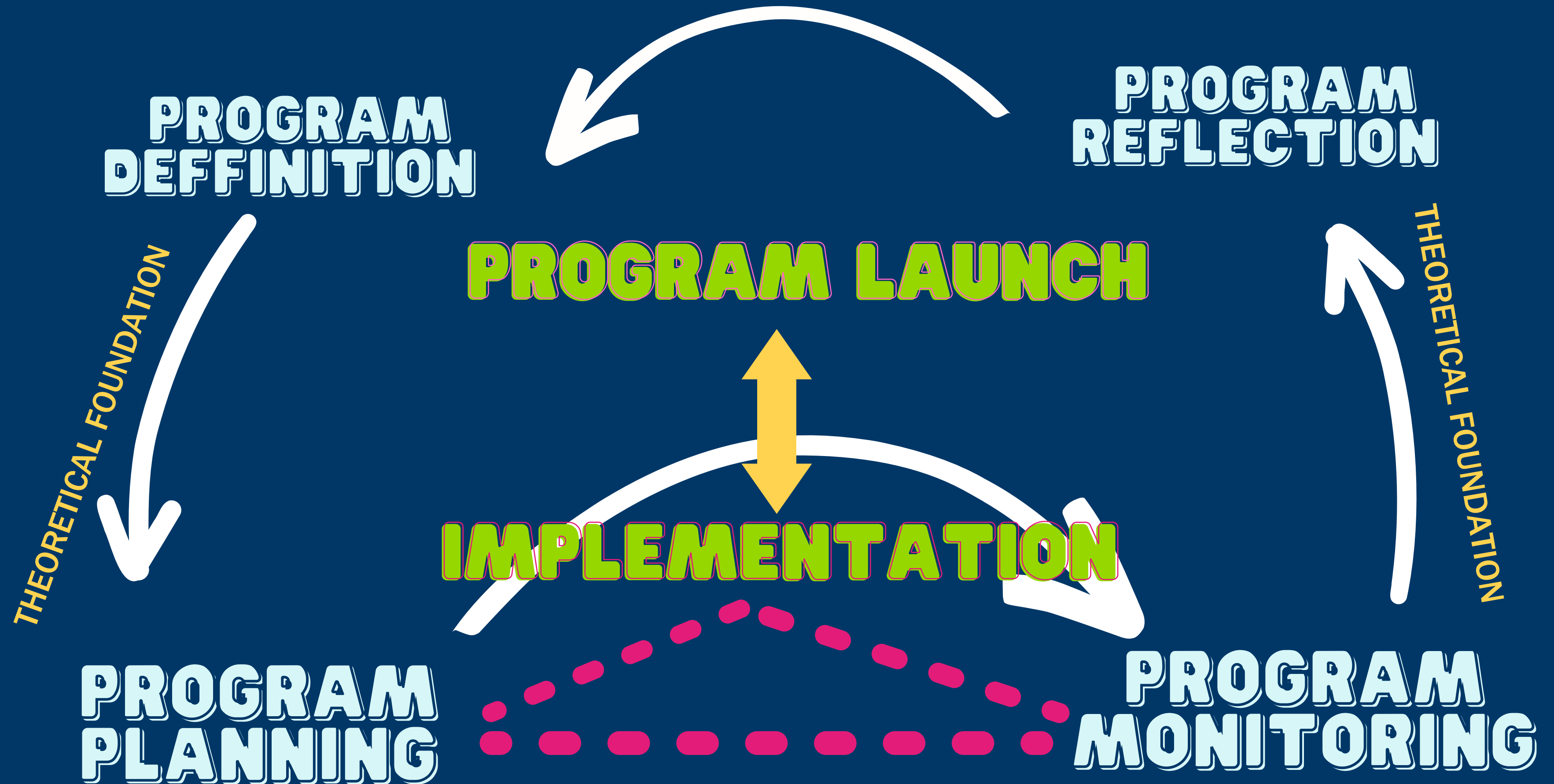
- **Could you create a strategic plan that outlines the initiative and how it fits into the culture of our/your institution?**

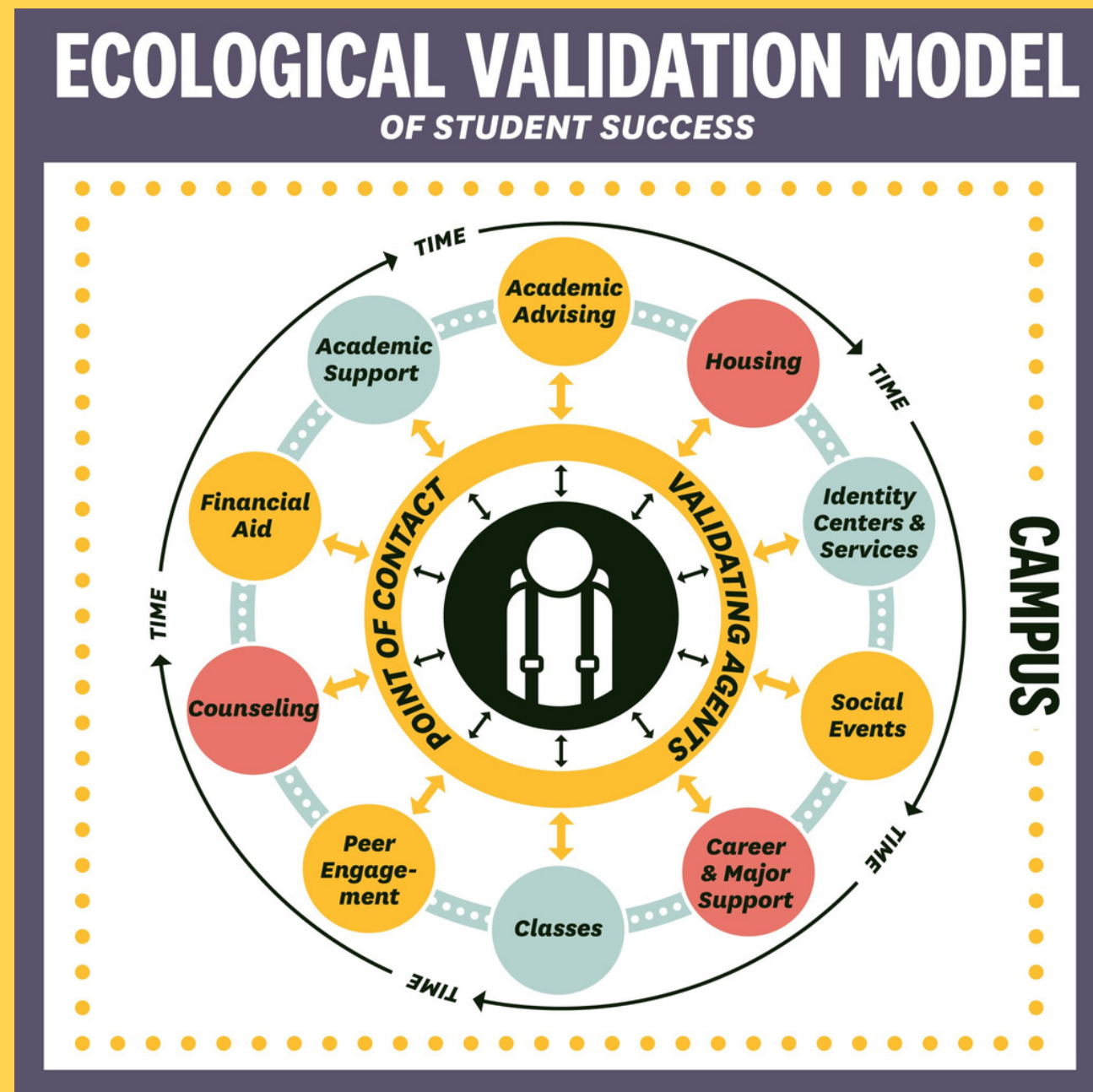

INTEGRATED MODEL FOR PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT:



THEORETICAL FOUNDATION:

The Ecological Validation Model of Student Success represents this approach to student support and success that our S.O.A.R.-ing Into Success orientation program promotes. Student success is described as ecological in nature and validates students' multiple identities, assets, strengths, and innate capabilities for success in a web of multiple coordinated student support contexts over time.



The model is described in terms of:

- what is being validated (Student- i.e., student characteristics, experiences, identities),
- how validation occurred (Process- academic and interpersonal validation);
- the multiple curated environments where validation occurred (Context- academic and student affairs departments, personnel, and events/activities); and
- when validation happens (Time- throughout college).

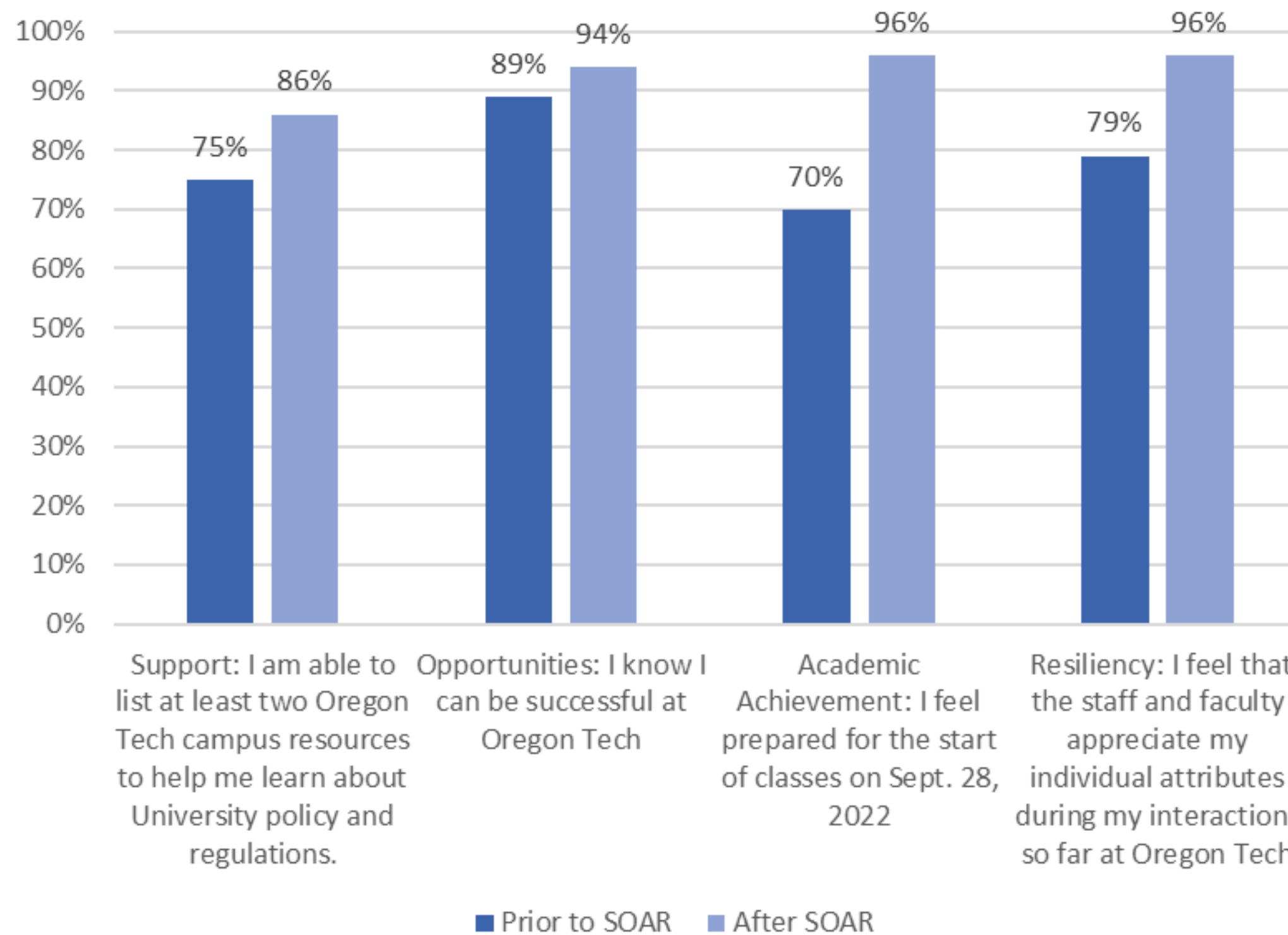

PROGRAM REFLECTION

CHALLENGES:

- Understanding the difference between our different First year experience programs
- More logistical details around space size, the technology available, timing, etc.
- More communication and starting earlier.
- More signage across campus during the event.
- Sitting for long periods of time was uncomfortable for the students.



POINTS OF PRIDE:

- Actively brought together the entire campus to welcome our incoming students.
- The high energy lasted throughout the whole event.
- 10+ opportunities to meet with faculty and staff across campus.
- 20+ opportunities for students to learn helpful resources and opportunities to be involved academically and socially.
- Parents/Supporters enjoyed their information session and the chance to have time for just them.
- Students were engaged in an intentional high-impact practice.
