Re-enrolling	Students who have not attended OIT in 4 or more terms must fill out OIT's re-enrolling form

	attended after leaving OIT. Linn-Benton Community College transcripts will automatically be sent to OIT.			
Deadlines &	Completed applications are due 3 weeks before the term starts. Cost is \$50, payable to OIT. No

Financial	OFAX will be used for transmission of	enrollment and grade information.

	The "home" institution (the college that pays the financial aid) shall be determined by the			
	student's immediate degree objective. For example, if the student's immediate degree objective is a bachelor's degree, then OIT will be designated as the "home" institution. Should the student be pursuing Associate degree prior to completing a bachelor's degree, PCC will be			
	designated as the "home" institution. Once a student has earned an Associate degree, then OIT will be the home institution. Once a student has earned an AAS or AAOT, then OIT will become the home institution.
