

OWLS PROJECTS: OUR WORLD TO LEAD AND SERVE

In the Oregon Tech Honors Program, we value leadership and service. We ask students to contribute 50 hours a year of service to the HP, for the first two years. To this end, HP students may select leadership and service opportunities from this list or devise their own opportunities. Please confirm the suitability of your leadership or service opportunity with your Core Faculty or the Director/Assistant Director prior to completion of a service or leadership opportunity. This list includes suggested opportunities—many others are possible:

- 1. Serve as the HP Social Media Director for a week (contribute stories and posts to Fb, or moderate an online Fb discussion)
- 2. Participate in campus-wide volunteer activities like the Campus Give Back Day, working on the concrete canoe, or a blood drive, or the Long Night Against Procrastination (you could sponsor a study table/group)
- 3. Host an HP movie night
- 4. Host an HP culture night or other HP event (disc golf, for example, or a picnic, a micro-fieldtrip, or a City as Text structured exploration)
- 5. Lead or contribute to a community service project (for example, work on or lead a Blue Zone project)
- 6. Serve an existing community need, like volunteering at a hospice center or the Humane Society, or a CASA event, or become a SMART reader for a term or a year
- 7. Assist the Director or Assistant Director in planning a HELIOS Fieldtrip (secure signatures, research readings, plan activities)
- 8. Contribute to curricular planning for a future Honors Idea Seminar
- 9. Volunteer to help on a recruiting event for the HP, like Fall Preview or Spring Open House (other students love to see and hear from you)
- 10. Volunteer to be the HP photojournalist on a HELIOS Fieldtrip: we'll feature your photographs on our HP website
