Minutes

Meeting called to order – Interim Chair Erin Foley

Chair Erin Foley called the meeting to order at 8:02 am.

1. Tuition Recommendation Committee Principles

2. Recommendation

Chair Erin Foley presented the draft recommendation memo for review.

- 2020-2021 Tuition Recommendation Memo from TRC and ASOIT to President Naganathan

- Both Memo's are presented to Board of Trustees Meeting on April 8, 2021

Abdy Afjeh asked for percentage of majors paying for differential tuition.

John Harman shared that there will be additional federal funding that could help alleviate the need to increase the differential tuition.

Abdy Afjeh cautioned TRC that the federal funding may be limited on types of use.

Mason Wichmann asked at what point does Oregon Tech stop increasing differentials and as of right now differential tuition is at 35%.

Peter Wantuck shared that around 65% of the students at Portland-Metro campus are paying for differential tuition. He shared a message from ASOIT-PM with discouragement on the continued increases to differential tuition, and the lack of priority to the Portland-Metro campus.

Erin Foley responded that there needs to be better communication so that students are aware of the improvements to Portland-Metro campus including classroom chairs, wi-fi, etc.

Rosanna Overholser suggested a creation of a report for the Portland-Metro campus to gather student feedback with plans and process for improvements.

Abdy Afjeh added that these student needs and concerns should be shared directly with Academic Affairs from ASOIT.

Richard Bailey agreed to the 4.9% increase to base tuition and proposed a 2% increase to differential tuition. TRC members agreed with no objections.

Abdy Afjeh shared that Academic Affairs plans to provide financial aid resources to students for the bring your own device program. There will be federal resources for students to apply for these technology needs.

Erin Foley shared that TRC will need to review the draft memo and provide feedback by Monday, March 15, 2021.
