Application Process	Online application only. Steps for dual enrollment: 1. Students must be currently admitted at either college. 2. Fill out the OIT dual application ( <a href="http://www.oit.edu/apply">www.oit.edu/apply</a> ). Students can be dually enrolled with multiple colleges at a time, but can only use credits from OIT and one dual partner to count toward enrollment for financial aid.	
Re-enrolling Process	Students who have not attended OIT in 4 or more terms must fill out OIT’s re-enrolling form ( <a href="https://www.oit.edu/admissions/returning-student">https://www.oit.edu/admissions/returning-student</a> ). Submit transcripts for other colleges attended after leaving OIT. Linn-Benton Community College transcripts will automatically be sent to OIT.	
Deadlines & App. Fee	Completed applications are due 3 weeks before the term starts.  We require a \$50 application fee at the time the application is submitted unless the student has an application fee waiver. We also require a confirmation of attendance and \$100 enrollment deposit, which goes towards their tuition and fees when they take classes and is non-refundable after certain dates, depending on the term.  Also, if a student applies to OIT and does not take classes in the term they are admitted, they must re-apply.	
Financial Aid	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students dual enrolling with PCC and OIT utilizing financial aid must complete a Consortium Agreement each term. If Oregon Tech is the home school the OIT Consortium Agreement must be received within the first two weeks of the term.</li> <li>• Students cannot have financial aid that pays out from more than one institution.</li> <li>• The “home” institution (the college that pays the financial aid) shall be determined by the student’s immediate degree objective. For example, if the student’s immediate degree objective is a bachelor’s degree, then OIT will be designated as the “home” institution. Should the student be pursuing Associate degree prior to completing a bachelor’s degree, PCC will be designated as the “home” institution. Once a student has earned an Associate degree, then OIT will be the home institution. Once a student has earned an AAS or AAOT, then OIT will become the home institution.</li> </ul>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students must take at least 6 credits from their home institution to qualify for or receive financial aid.</li> </ul>
Disability Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Register with disability services at either institution where accommodations are needed. Each institution is responsible for providing accommodations in courses for its campus.</li> </ul>
