



Median Annual Earning 5 Years After Graduation








Oregon Tech Non-ACP Student Enrollment




Market Bifurcation

Accreditation Reaffirmed



In June, the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) released its decision on Oregon Tech's Year 7 Self-Evaluation Report and site visit.

Oregon Tech received a positive endorsement of our strategic initiatives and direction as a polytechnic university, and NWCCU has reaffirmed our institutional accreditation.


Doctor of Physical Therapy

- The DPT program received “Candidacy Status” in April 2023.
- The first cohort was seated summer 2023.
- The self-study for full accreditation is due fall 2025.
- A site visit will occur in winter 2026.
- The final decision will be at the May CAPTE meeting 2026.
- The first class will graduate spring 2026.
- As of Sept. 6, 115 applications have been submitted for the incoming 2024 cohort.



\$18 million geothermal investment in Klamath Falls

- Oregon Tech has successfully secured \$18,160,000 in state bond funding to complete a full renovation of the university's unique geothermal heating and hot water system at its Klamath Falls campus.
- This crucial funding will renovate the existing geothermal system that supplies the entire campus.

Preparing for a Comprehensive Capital Campaign



- Tech Foundation created a five-year strategic plan
- One primary goal in the plan is to conduct a comprehensive capital campaign. What does that mean?
- A multi-year campaign to support programs, capital projects, research, scholarships, and other institutional priorities such as endowed faculty positions, centers, and so forth...
- Process: Foundation professional staff and volunteer leadership are meeting with campaign consultants to help conduct a feasibility study, develop a case for support, create a campaign timeline, and help identify an overall campaign goal.





AIRE Center

Advancing Interdisciplinary
Research on the Environment
Oregon Institute of Technology

- The AIRE Center has been tackling a range of environmentally related research projects.
- The largest and longest running project is the Hospital Burden and Air Quality project (HBAQ).
- Also developed a GIS mapping-based analysis that can be used by community organizations to identify the greatest threats of hospitalization during wildfire smoke events.
- Also developed a robust air quality monitoring system that includes filter-based systems to capture not just how many particles are in the air we breath, but what is actually in the smoke.

Innovation Hub status

- Oregon Institute of Technology received \$140,000 from Business Oregon/[Oregon Innovation Council](#) (Oregon InC) to propose a regional innovation hub in South Central Oregon.
- The hub will provide local entrepreneurs access to technical assistance, capital, networking, mentorship, and talent development in the region.
- Regional Innovation Hubs are a new Oregon InC initiative to advance innovation in Oregon.
- Oregon Tech will serve as the lead for the South-Central Oregon Regional Innovation (SCORI) hub and partner with:
 - Klamath Community College
 - Klamath County Economic Development Association
 - KCC Small Business Development Center
 - Klamath IDEA
 - Lake County Chamber of Commerce
 - The City of Klamath Falls and Klamath County commissioners will serve as collaborative partners.



Oregon Manufacturing Innovation Center (OMIC R&D) Awarded Center of Innovation Excellence (CIE) Designation

- OMIC R&D - a public/private partnership of 40+ industry members.
- CIEs are a key strategy of the State's 10-Year Innovation Plan.
- CIEs are intended to focus on supporting innovation within an emerging or established sector of importance to the state's economy.
- Expected to leverage increasing amounts of non-state funding over time, via strong public-private partnerships.

Institutional Goals for 2023-24

- 1. As part of the Academic Master Plan implementation, launch a 5-Yr academic program review cycle for all academic majors.**
- 2. Initiate a revision of Gen Ed curriculum aligned with state-level initiatives.**
- 3. Achieve at least a 1% growth in new students in Fall 2024.**
- 4. Achieve at least a 2% increase in retention of new undergraduate students.**
- 5. In partnership with OTF, increase annual \$ raised by 5% from \$2.5M to \$2.625M.**
- 6. Develop and implement a Center for Wellbeing at Oregon Tech.**
- 7. Launch at least 4 online certificates, with focus on military-affiliated and international students, with a goal to enroll 30+ students in 2024-25.**
- 8. Pilot the feasibility of an immersive polytechnic education center model.**




Comprehensive Approach to Mental Health & Wellbeing

- **Best practice is to create a comprehensive plan to spearhead university wellbeing across all aspects of university functioning.**
- **Oregon Tech Strategic Plan addresses campus-wide wellbeing directly:**
 - **Pillar III, Goal 6, Objective 6.2: “Support the wellbeing and development of all members of the university community.”**
- **The new Oregon Tech Center for Wellbeing, headed by Gaylyn Maurer, will meet this need by providing support to both employees and students.**

Online Learning and Global Engagement: Online focus areas

- Continue to improve and expand our online course and program offerings
- Increase faculty support for online course design and development
- Work toward more standardized online course navigation for students
- Develop a new extended education platform to promote new and existing online courses and programs to new and underserved student communities seeking:
 - Certificates
 - Stackable credentials
 - Micro-credentialing
 - Competency badges
 - Just in Time learning (JiT) options



Online Learning and Global Engagement: International focus areas


- International student and faculty mobility opportunities such as:
