employers Search for an internship or job	 applicant tracking systems (for when you upload your resume electronically): No templates, tables, symbols, or headers; using a plain font like Calibri or Arial, incorporating related keywords. Think about both what you can offer and what you want to gain from an internship. You can gain skills, experience, & references. Research prospective employers using their websites, LinkedIn company pages, library databases, and Google. Create a spreadsheet or find another system to track internship/job leads and applications. Review dress guidelines for your industry. Develop wardrobe for interviews. Remember to ask each firm about interview attire. Practice interviewing. Schedule a mock interview if you need one. Attend career fairs and other recruiting events on campus.
